

# Dr. David A. Denisch

Dr. David A. Denisch's ancestors were among the first settlers of Frederick and Harford Counties. Raised in Baltimore since the age of 8, he attended Baltimore City College High School. Dr. Denisch did his undergraduate studies at the University of Maryland College Park, and graduated from the first and oldest dental school in the world, the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, Dental School, University of Maryland. He was captain in the US Army Dental Corps, as well as a Clinical Instructor, at his alma mater.

In addition to his advanced degrees, he received many awards and honors. He is both a Fellow and a Master of the American Academy of General Dentistry, Fellow of the International College of Dentists, and Pierre Fauchard Academy. He received acclamations from the Governor and the State of Maryland for his work as a master dentist. Baltimore Magazine selected him as one of 4 "Top Docs" in his field. He also was named "America's Top Dentist" by the Consumer Research Council. He has been working in private practice in restorative dentistry with Dr. T.L. Llewellyn and is part of the staff at St. Joseph and GB Medical Centers.



Dr. Denisch has been an active member of numerous cultural and professional organizations, including Sons of Confederate Veterans, Society for the History of Germans in Maryland, the Nature Conservancy, and St. George's Society. Of course, he is also one of the directors of the German Society of Maryland.

He is a man of many hobbies: preserving the environment and learning from it, running, hiking, bicycling, beachcombing, gardening, studies in Christianity, Libertarianism, and creation research. However, his prime hobby is keeping alive the memory of his pioneering German ancestors by spreading the word and helping in the preservation of Schifferstadt, which was built 11 generations ago, Joseph Brunner, who emigrated from Germany in 1729. He serves as a docent at the Schifferstadt Architectural Museum in Frederick and is always present at the entrance of the museum wearing colonial garb for the Schifferstadt Oktoberfest and other events.






#### Schifferstadt Architectural Museum

This year marks the 250th anniversary of the building of Schifferstadt by the Brunner family. Built in 1756, Schifferstadt Architectural Museum is one of the oldest and most historic buildings in the City of Frederick, Maryland, as well as one of the best examples of early Colonial German Architecture in the United States. The large stone house was built on 303 acres of virgin timberland by Joseph Brunner, a German immigrant, and his descendants. Brunner and his family left their village of Klein Schifferstadt in 1729 in hopes of gaining independence, including the right to own property and build a home in the "New Land."



Although its exterior features and interior have been altered over the years, Schifferstadt has many well-preserved features that reflect the German traditions of its builders. The stone house now on the site was built during the time that Joseph Brunner's youngest son, Elias Brunner, owned the farm, and likely replaced an earlier log home. Schifferstadt has two-foot thick sandstone walls, made with stone from a local quarry near Walkersville, Maryland. Its hand-hewn beams are pinned together with wooden pegs. A stone house was a sign of a family's social and financial success and stability. It also was able to provide refuge to the extended Brunner family during the French and Indian War. The house was owned by members of the Brunner family until the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, although it later became a rental property and much of the original acreage was sold off. By 1972, the house had fallen into a state of disrepair and was in danger of being torn down to make way for a gasoline station. Fortunately, the newly formed Frederick County Landmarks Foundation recognized the historic value of the structure and assumed the task of raising money to buy the property. The Maryland Historical Trust also contributed a \$60,000 interestfree loan toward the 1974 purchase of the property for \$65,000.



More than 5,000 people visit the museum and its beautiful heritage garden each year. The museum hosts a variety of events each year, including an annual spring festival and Oktoberfest. On December 9, visitors will be able to see colonial living demonstrations, participate in wreath-making, music and children's crafts.
